## RECEPTION AND MUSEUM STORE

---

When I enter the museum, I will first see the lobby and reception area. Here, it might be crowded, and noisy, but other spaces will be quieter. To go to the exhibitions where I can see artifacts, I need to purchase a ticket to the museum. I might have to wait in line at the Ticket Desk. I will wait patiently for my turn to talk to a guest assistant.

At the reception, I will get my tickets and a key for my coat check. If I need any helpful resources such as a Sensory Map (PDF) or noise reducing earmuffs, I can ask a guest assistant at the desk. They will guide me where to get it.

## TEKNO CAFÉ

---

When I come into the museum, I may see a café on the right called Tekno Café. It might be busy and noisy, with music and people talking and eating. I might smell the food that they are cooking.

Tekno Café staff is friendly.

I can go to the Café area anytime I am hungry or thirsty.

At the Tekno Café, I can buy some food or drinks.

If I bring my own food with me, I can eat it in the Café area as well.

## COAT CHECK

---

If I have coats that I don't want to wear in the museum, I can leave them at the lockers or walk-in closets. If I have any food or juice with me, I will have to leave that too. I will pick it up when I leave.

I can store my coats and bags in a walk-in closet or lockers. The guest assistant will give my parents/teacher a key to the walk-in closet. The walk-in closet is a small room with hooks and a colorful door.

## HELPFUL RESOURCES

---

In case I need some helpful resources such as earmuffs, I can ask the guest assistant at the front desk. They can help us find these helpful tools.

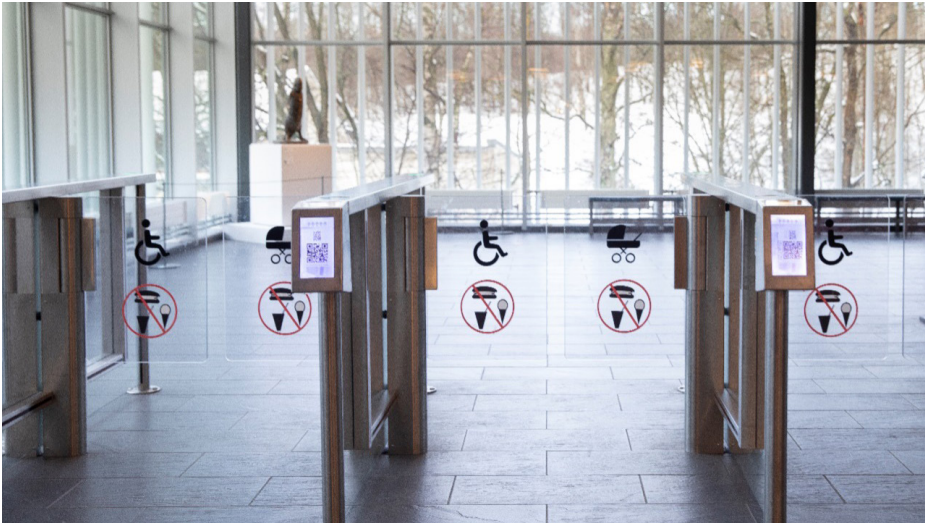


## HELPFUL PEOPLE

Around the museum, I may see people wearing a uniform. They are called museum mediators. They wear black vests, shirts or lab coats with the Teknisk Museum logo. 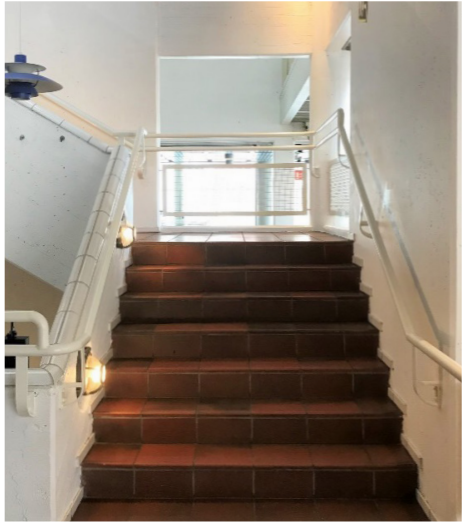

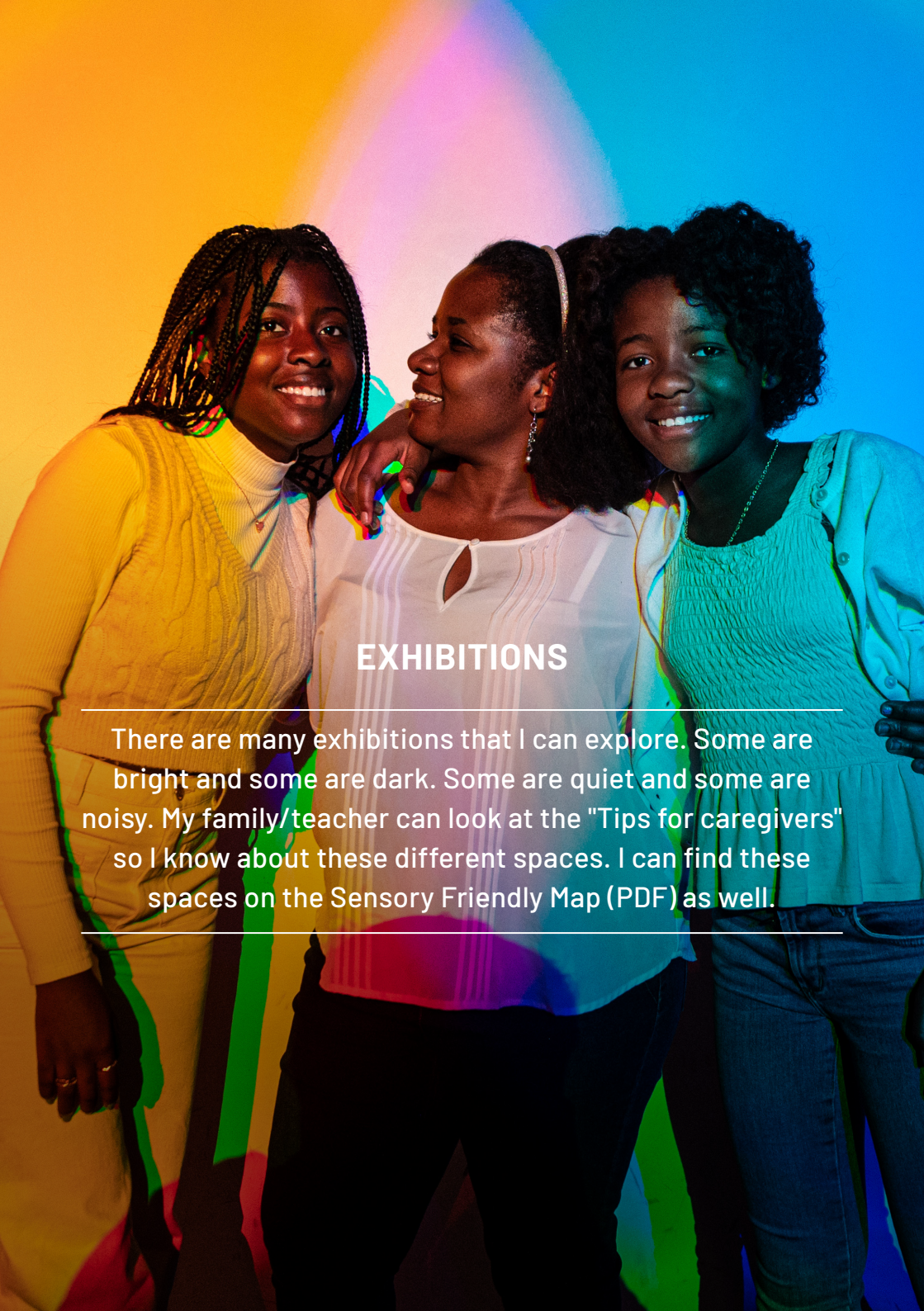


## RESTROOMS

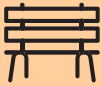
## NEED A BREAK?
